Minutes of meeting held through Video Conferencing (VC) on 04.11.2024 in respect of Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and Uttarakhand

A meeting of the Project Approval Committee was held on 04.11.2023 for review of MPC and appraisal of proposals of Government of Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and Uttarakhand for MPCs under PM JANMAN under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Naval Jit Kapoor, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs. 2. At the outset, the PAC and the States were briefed about the sanction and the progress of MPCs sanctioned so far.

(i). Ministry has allocated **823 MPCs** to 15 States including State(s) of Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and Uttarakhand.

(ii). State Governments have been asked to expedite issuance of tender document, identification of construction agency as per extant guidelines.

(iii). The physical and financial progress needs to be updated on the Gatishakti Portal.

(iv). Ministry is in receipt of fresh proposals of construction of Multi Purpose Centers (MPCs) from States of Chhattisgarh, Tamil Nadu, Tripura and Uttarakhand. The proposals in respect of each state were examined and deliberated with following observations.

3. Chhattisgarh: State of Chhattisgarh has been given target of 75 MPCs, out of which 73 MPCs have been sanctioned with approved amount of Rs 4380.00 lakhs (@Rs 60.00 lakh per MPC as per MPC guideline) and Rs.852.39 lakhs have been released during current financial year. Now Chhattisgarh has submitted details of **additional 2** proposals of MPCs. The state made a detailed presentation on this

issue and justified the requirement of MPCs at the locations proposed by the state. After the discussion with state, the committee approved 2 MPCs with detail of locations (**Annexure I**) as proposed by state, which falls within the guidelines.

4. Tamil Nadu: Tamil Nadu, has been allocated target of 50 MPCs and Ministry has already sanctioned construction of 25 MPCs and approved Rs 1500.00 lakhs (@Rs 60.00 lakh per MPC as per MPC guideline) and Rs.1009.88 lakhs have been released so far. Now, the Government of Tamil Nadu has submitted details of additional 40 proposals of MPCs. The state made a detailed presentation with justification for proposed MPCs at the locations. After the detailed discussion with state, the committee observed that **35 locations (Annexure II)** proposed by state is broadly covered under the guidelines of MPCs. For the remaining 5 location PAC deferred the proposals. It was deliberated that in many states the actual requirement of MPCs is less than the target given, eg in the case of Uttarakhand, the demand is much less than the quota of 25 as can be seen in the upcoming paras. Therefore, PAC approved allocation of additional 10 MPCs.

5. Tripura: Tripura has been given target of 50 MPCs and Ministry has already sanctioned construction of 39 MPCs approved Rs 2340.00 lakhs (@Rs 60.00 lakh per MPC as per MPC guideline) and Rs. 457.38 lakhs have been released during previous financial year. Now, the Government of Tripura, Tribal Development Department has submitted details of additional 11 proposals of MPCs along with approval of change of location (at Ujjan Nuncherra PVTG habitations in Unakoti District) for 1 MPC. The state made a detailed presentation and after discussions, the committee observed that 11 number of locations (**Annexure III**) proposed by state are broadly covered under the guidelines of MPCs. The committee also accorded for the proposed change of location for 1 MPC.

6. Uttarakhand: In the case of Uttarakhand, it was apprised that targets for the State for construction of MPCs is 25 and Ministry has already sanctioned construction of 9 MPCs and approved Rs 540.00 lakhs (@Rs 60.00 lakh per MPC as per MPC guideline) and Rs. 301.19 lakhs have been released so far. Now, the Government of Uttarakhand has proposed 2 MPCs. The state made a detailed presentation and after the detailed discussion with state, the committee observed that 2 number of locations (**Annexure IV**) proposed by state is broadly covered under the guidelines of MPCs. It was also submitted by the State that the State does not require more MPCs. The PAC acceded to the request of the State and decided to allocate the MPCs to Tamilnadu form the allocation of Uttarakhand. The State was asked to reconfirm the requirements after verification with the concerned DMs.

7. The approvals accorded by Committee, State-wise, are as under:

In respect of **Chhattisgarh**, the Committee approved construction of **2 new MPCs** (as per **Annexure-I**) along with in-principle approval of total cost of Rs. 120.00 lakhs (@Rs. 60 lakhs per MPC as per MPC guideline x 2 MPC). However, additional funds will be

released only after utilization of already released funds and submission of Utilization Certificate (UC). State Government may utilize the fund already released so far towards the construction of MPCs. The state government was advised to take necessary measures for calling the tenders and allotment of works by following transparent procedure.

ii. In respect of **Tamil Nadu**, the Committee approved construction of **35 new MPCs** (as per **Annexure – II**) along with in-principle approval of total cost of Rs. 2100.00 lakhs (@Rs. 60 lakhs per MPC as per MPC guideline x 35 MPC). However, additional funds will be released only after utilization of already released funds and submission of Utilization Certificate (UC). State Government may utilize the fund already released so far towards the construction of MPCs. The state government was advised to take necessary measures for calling the tenders and allotment of works by following transparent procedure.

iii. In respect of **Tripura**, the Committee approved construction of **11 new MPC** (as per **Annexure – III**) along with in-principle approval of total cost of Rs. 660.00 lakhs (@Rs. 60 lakhs per MPC as per MPC guideline x 11 MPC). However, additional funds will be released only after utilization of already released funds and submission of Utilization Certificate (UC). State Government may utilize the fund already released so far towards the construction of MPCs. The state government was advised to take necessary measures for calling the tenders and allotment of works by following transparent procedure.

iv. In respect of **Uttarakhand**, the Committee approved construction of **2 new MPC** (as per **Annexure – IV**) along with in-principle approval of total cost of Rs. 120.00 lakhs (@Rs. 60 lakhs per MPC as per MPC guideline x 2 MPC). However, additional funds will be released only after utilization of already released funds and submission of Utilization Certificate (UC). State Government may utilize the fund already released so far towards the construction of MPCs. The state government was advised to take necessary measures for calling the tenders and allotment of works by following transparent procedure.

8. With approval of these 50 PMCs, the **total number of MPC units approved under PAMJANMAN** has now increased to **873** from 823 MPCs sanctioned earlier (481 MPC sanctioned on 12.01.2024 and 09 MPCs sanctioned on 06.02.2024 plus 167 MPC sanctioned on 21.02.2024 plus 105 sanctioned on dated 28.02.2024 plus 60 sanctioned on dated 01.03.2024 01 MPC on dated 09.07.2024). The State-wise details of number of MPCs sanctioned are at **Annexure-V**. The state can approach for release of funds after the submission of UC and compliance of SNA requirement¹². The Committee approved the above proposals with following conditions to be followed by the State Governments:

- i. The State ensure and confirm that the land identified for the purpose is adequate for construction of the center and ownership of the land has been transferred in the name of State TWD.
- ii. In the case of infrastructure facilities, norms and schedule of rates (SoR) fixed by the State Government need to be followed. The construction must be carried out only on Government / Public land.
- iii. Recommendation of DLCC and approval of Principal Secretary on the proposal has been obtained.
- iv. Construction of the MPC is carried out by State Govt. Agency, or any other agency identified by the State following the prescribed procedure and fiscal prudence in a transparent manner as per stipulated timeline.
- v. Construction cost of the Centre including furniture, fixture, fittings, and other basic requirements for the centre does not exceed Rs. 60 lakhs.
- vi. The State will also ensure that all necessary clearances whether under Central or State Act/Rules/Regulations is obtained by the State.
- vii. The State will ensure that technical scrutiny of estimates for the work is done by competent authority as per provisions of DFPR applicable in the state and project is executed by Govt. agency in a transparent manner.
- viii. The State TWD will submit a detailed report to MoTA after complying with the above stipulations by the Ministry. A dedicated module has been created in PM Gati Shakti Portal. The data in respect of these MPCs need to be updated on the PM-Gatishakti Portal. The financial and physical progress of the MPC needs to be updated on Portal.
- ix. Wherever there is Anganwadi or Mini Anganwadi with staff and Anganwadi and Anganwadi is kachha, the same will be shifted to the MPC. Further if there is Pucca Anganwadi with staff in the same habitation/village where MPC is approved, no separate staff for Anganwadi will be provided in the MPC.
- x. The State should finalize mechanisms for maintenance of these MPCs as per guidelines and coordinate with the concerned line departments for provision of staff.

9. Progress of the MPC work reviewed, and states are further advised on the following lines:

- i. To do comprehensive mapping of PVTG area and look for new requirements of MPCs
- ii. Closely monitor the progress of the MPC work and share progress updates along with photographs.
- iii. States are advised to closely monitor financial progress and keep track of funds in SNA accounts.
- iv. State TWD to talk to allied department for requisite services of Anganwadi and/or Health Centre and/or Skill Centers.
- v. Also explore possibilities of opening of VDVK at MPC
- vi. Finalize the operational plan for each MPC, with specific responsibility of concerned stakeholder for its maintenance
