Minutes of meeting held through Video Conferencing (VC) on 06.02.2024 in respect of Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and Kerala States

A meeting of the Committee was held on 06.02.2023 for appraisal of proposals of Government of Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and Kerala for Multi-Purpose Centres (MPCs) under PM JANMAN under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Naval Jit Kapoor, Additional Secretary, Ministry of Tribal Affairs. 2. At the outset, it was apprised that Ministry has sanctioned Rs.100 Cr (approx..) for 481 MPCs to 15 States including State(s) of Rajasthan, Kerala and Uttarakhand. Now, the concerned State Governments are required to expedite the finalization of DPRs, issue of tender document and identification of construction agency. It was also stated that while approving the MPCs, the following criteria was adopted:

- i. No AWC and No Health Centre in the proposed locations
- ii. Clear Land details specified with particulars like Khata no/Khastra no./Survey no.
- iii. Forest land without clear land titles excluded from the categories identified as per point no. ii above.
- iv. In case of States where criteria (i) has not been fulfilled, in that case gap in one of the infrastructures viz AWC & HC has been considered

- v. In case of eligible locations, if Latitude and Longitude are available, the location may be considered

3. Further, it was stated that Ministry is in receipt of proposals of multi-purpose centres (MPCs) under PM-JANMAN in respect of States of Rajasthan, Uttarakhand and Kerala.

Rajasthan

4. In case of Rajasthan, it was apprised that targets for the State for MPCs is 50 and Ministry has already sanctioned 16 MPCs and Rs. 332.64 lakhs have been released during current financial year. Now, the Government of Rajasthan, Tribal Area Development Department has submitted details of revised proposals of 16 MPCs and it is observed that 03 MPCs viz. Sandhri, Harinagar, Mehrawta have been approved earlier by the Committee. State Government has proposed for change of locations in respect of 13 MPCs.

5. In this reference, District Collector, Baran stated that earlier the State Government has proposed the MPCs keeping in view where the VDVks are present and on receipt of sanction of 16 MPCs from the Ministry, it was observed that in those 16 locations, issues were being faced for provision of anganwadi/sub-health centres. In view of the State Government has proposed revised locations wherein either building of AWC/health centres are not available or in damaged condition and these MPCs have been mapped with availability of VDVks so that the MPCs can be utilized by VDVks.

Uttarakhand

6. In case of Uttarakhand, it was apprised that targets for the State for MPCs is 25 and Ministry has already sanctioned 3 MPCs in Udham Singh Nagar and Rs. 62.37 lakhs have been released during current financial year. Now, Government of Uttarakhand, Tribal Welfare Department has submitted 06 new proposals of MPCs, amounting to Rs. 355.46 lakhs, in the Districts of Pithoragarh (5) and Haridwar (1).

7. State Government representative stated that in the proposed locations, there is non-availability of either AWC or Govt. health centre; in case of Madanpur village, there is non-availability of both the infrastructure and these have been proposed in Govt. land.

Kerala

8. In case of Kerala, it was apprised that targets for the State for MPCs is 15 and Ministry has already sanctioned 11 MPCs in Wayanad and Palakkad Distirct and Rs. 228.69 lakhs have been relased during current financial year. Now, Government of Kerala, Scheduled Tribes Development Department has submitted 20 proposals amounting to Rs.1200 lakhs, in the Districts of Thrissur (1), Kasragod (1), Kozhikkode (1), Wayanad (5) and Palakkad (12).

9. Since, targets for MPCs in Kerala is 15 and 11 MPCs have already been sanctioned in Wayanad and Palakkad Distirct, State was advised to prioritize the proposals among the Districts and submit the proposal to the Ministry accordingly. Meanwhile, the Districts where no MPCs have been approved may be considered.

10. Accordingly, the Committee decided to approved the following of proposals, State-wise, are as under:

- i. In respect of Rajasthan, the Committee approved the 13 changed locations (in place of earlier approved location) as per **Annexure-I** subject to no additional funds for the revised locations and State to utilize earlier sanctioned funds for intiating works. Besides, 13 locations (also indicated in Annexure-I) earlier approved during meeting of the Committee held on 10.01.2024 and sanctioned vide letter no. 11015/20/2023-PVTG dated 12.01.2024 stands cancelled in view of revision of locations by the State Government.
- ii. In respect of Uttarakhand, the Committee approved the 06 new MPCs as per **Annexure-II** along with in-principle approval of total funds Rs.355.46 lakhs of subject to no additional funds will be released during the current financial year and State Government may utilize earlier sanctioned funds for these MPCs for initiating the works.
- iii. In respect of Kerala, the Committee approved the 03 new MPCs as per **Annexure-III** along with in-principle approval of total funds Rs.180.00 lakhs of subject to no additional funds will be released during the current financial year and State Government may utilize earlier sanctioned funds for these MPCs for initiating the works.
- iv. The total number of units approved for each State has now increased to 490 (481 on 12.01.2024 + 6 (UK)+3(KL) – Approved in principle now). The details of no. of MPCs, State-wise, are at **Annexure-IV**.

11. The Committee approved the above proposals with following conditions to be followed by the State Governments:

- i. The State to ensure and confirm that the land identified for the purpose is adequate for construction of the centre and ownership of the land has been transferred in the name of State TWD.
- ii. In case of infrastructure facilities, norms and schedule of rates (SoR) fixed by the State Government to be followed. The construction must be carried out only on Government / Public land.
- iii. Recommendation of DLCC and approval of Principal Secretary on the proposal has been obtained.
- iv. Construction of the Centre is carried out by State Govt. Agency or any other agency identified by the State following the prescribed procedure and fiscal prudence in a transparent manner as per stipulated timeline;
- v. Construction cost of the Centre including furniture, fixture, fittings and other basic requirements for the centre does not exceed Rs. 60 lakh.
- vi. The State is to submit estimated cost details according to the Schedule of Rates (SoR) within the prescribed ceiling with the certificate that the proposed rates have been vetted by the technical Department;
- vii. State will also ensure that all necessary clearances whether under Central or State Act/Rules/Regulations is obtained by the State.
- viii. State will ensure that technical scrutiny of estimates for the work is done by competent authority as per provisions of DFPR applicable in the state and project is executed by Govt. agency in a transparent manner.
- ix. The State TWD will submit detailed report to MoTA after complying the above stipulations by the Ministry. A dedicated module has been created in PM Gati Shakti Portal. The data in respect of these MPCs need to be updated on the PM-Gatishakti Portal. The financial and physical progress of the MPC needs to be updated on Portal.
- x. Wherever there is Anganwadi or Mini Anganwadi with staff and Anganwadi and Anganwadi is kachha, the same will be shifted to the MPC. Further if there is Pucca Anganwadi with staff in the same habitation/village where MPC is approved, no separate staff for Anganwadi will be provided in the MPC.
- xi. The State should finalise mechanism for maintenance of these MPCs as per guidelines and coordinate with the concerned line departments for provision of staff.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.
