Subject:- Release of Grants in Aid for Creation of Capital Assets (Charged) under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of "Support to Tribal Research Institutes (TRIs)" to Uttarakhand during the year 2024-25.

Sir,

I am directed to convey the sanction of the President of India for release an amount of **₹2,52,70,000 (Rupees Two Crore Fifty Two Lakh Seventy Thousand Only)** as 1st instalment (Grants in Aid for Creation of Capital Assets (Charged)) under Centrally Sponsored Scheme of "Support to TRIs" to Government of Uttarakhand during the year 2024-25 to carry out the activities approved by APEX committee of the Ministry in its meeting dated 06.09.2023 and common activities approved in its meeting dated 21.10.2024. The details of the activities are as under:

1.1.1. Committed Liabilities:

The Apex Committee examined the proposal of the TRI with respect to the committed liabilities. It was noted that an amount of ₹590.09 lakh has not yet been released out of the approved amount for the TRI since the year 2021-22. Only ₹235.00 lakh is being sought out of ₹590.09 lakh in the proposal of the TRI Uttarakhand as follows:

3. The grant should be utilized for the purpose for which it has been sanctioned and should not be diverted for any other activities.


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4. As per Rule 236(1) of GFR-2017, the accounts of the Organizations shall be opened to inspection by the sanctioning authority and audit, both by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India under the provision of CAG (DPC) Act 1971 and Internal audit by the Principal Accounts Office of the Ministry or Department, whenever the Institution or Organization is called upon to do so.



Minutes of the Apex Committee meeting under the Chairpersonship of Secretary (TA) on 21.10.2024 (Monday) to consider the Annual Action Plan for Janjatiya Gaurav Divas and 150th Commemorative year of Varsh under the scheme 'Support to TRIs'.

A meeting of the Apex Committee was held under the chairpersonship of Secretary (TA) on 21.10.2024 to consider the Annual Action Plan of activities to be undertaken by the TRIs on the occasion of Janjatiya Gaurav Divas and Varsh. List of Participants is annexed.

1. At the outset, Ms. R. Jaya, Additional Secretary welcomed all the participants, and updated the status of Adi Sanskriti and preparedness regarding activities to be undertaken for Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas(JJGD) and year long commemoration of the 150th birth anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda. She informed that JJGD will be celebrated from 15th November to 26th November 2024 and this will mark the beginning of Janjatiya Gaurav Varsh to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda. She explained the expectations from the TRIs during this period and the entire next year starting from JJGD, 2024.
2. She informed that a number of events to project initiatives and achievements of the ministry and related to tribal welfare will be celebrated. She also informed that one mega National level event will be held which the Hon'ble PM is expected to grace. She informed that the State events and events at district level, similar to the events held during PM JANMAN launch, are to be held in all 549 districts covered under the Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan. She also informed that financial provision like that of IEC Campaign would be made available for all the districts for holding these events.
3. STA emphasized that activities like outreach programme, organizing cultural events, activities relating to livelihood, Education and Health should be included in the list of activities to be undertaken by all TRIs.
4. STA asked each state to take one spike (a peak period) committed till March 2025 which will be a culmination of all the efforts being put by TRIs. STA further instructed that, to ensure maximum outreach of the JJGD to all stakeholders, Manthan Shivir as was done for the PM-JANMAN & Dharti Aaba Schemes at the national level, should be held immediately before 15th November in the states and districts level. The same should be replicated in the block level as well from 15 November onward. STA stated that every State should take this opportunity to spread awareness about the JJGD/Dharti Aaba Mission to every stakeholder. Issues which needs urgent intervention like FRA should be identified and proposals may be sent to the line Ministry concerned. TRIs were instructed to do the liaising part efficiently in so far as PM-JANMAN and Dharti Aaba Schemes are concerned. It was stated that MoTA is expecting 100% actual saturation from States on the specified interventions latest by 26.11.2024. The areas to be touched upon were guided by the STA for the 15-26 November i.e., demo class by tribal artist, outreach by schemes, culture, health, education, and livelihood. He advised to consider this as an outreach to create awareness about the government programs and schemes.
5. Thereafter, the Apex Committee considered the proposal of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and decided that the following activities be carried out by TRIs for the commemoration of the 150th Birth Anniversary of Bhagwan Birsa Munda starting from 15th November, 2024 to 15th November 2025:

6. It was instructed that the expenses should be incurred in a cost-effective manner, following transparent and efficient procurement procedures.

7. Apex Committee also made following observations which have to be complied with while implementing the projects sanctioned by the Ministry under the scheme.

(a) Funds will be released to the State Government subject to furnishing of Utilization Certificate and compliances of SNA balance, including the releases for replenishment of the funds that would be utilized for the JJGD event.

(b) Interest accrued in the SNA Account has to be deposited in Consolidated Fund of India as per DoE OM dt. 30.06.2021

(c) All procurements will be done following the procedures of obtaining technical and administrative approvals from the competent authorities.

(d) Funds which are unutilized for other projects in the SNA may be utilized for the purpose of conducting these activities subject to the condition that the Head of Account shall not be changed.
